Group Vision Penn State will use appropriate learning analytic tools and share relevant data with students, faculty, and staff members on a timely basis to enhance student success.

Identified Actions

- Develop a vision for learning analytics
- Guide the implementation of select tools and applications as well as future system integrations (Exs. LionPATH, Starfish, Canvas, Civitas)
- Coordinate the communication and assessment strategies
- Coordinate research related to learning analytics
- Recommend policy and procedures regarding the appropriate use of learning analytics

Working Group | Student Engagement Network Advisory Group

Goal 2 Implementation of Student Engagement Network; Develop inventory of engagement opportunities; Create HUB-based and virtual Engagement Space

Group Vision The SEN Advisory Group convenes to provide insight, comments, and ideas/advice regarding the planning, design, and creation of both the physical engagement space in the HUB as well as the digital/online portal.

Identified Actions

- Launch the Student Engagement Network by December 2018, including both the online presence and physical Engagement Space in the HUB-Robeson Center

Working Group | Enhanced Educational Pathways Committee

Goal 3 Partnership with K-12 toward college readiness and retention; Programs designed for veterans and other lifespan communities; Continue progress with micro-scholarships, Enhanced Educational Pathways (EEP) student transition and college completion programs, financial literacy, online dual enrollment and additional pilot projects

Group Vision Identify opportunities and pursue initiatives to improve access to, and affordability of, a Penn State education.

Identified Actions

- Use existing knowledge or develop an understanding of the factors that contribute to the cost of a Penn State degree
- Identify opportunities to address those factors from a systems-level perspective, with harmonized interventions that will advance our mission through access
- Pursue the projects with the greatest potential for short-term (1-3 year) and mid-term (3-5 year) impact

Working Group | Open Educational Resources

Goal 1 Review and expansion of Open Educational Resource (OER) initiatives; Integration with pedagogical innovation and broader educational transformation

Group Vision Penn State will become a leader in open and affordable course content among its peer institutions in support of President Barron's access and affordability imperative.

Identified Actions

- The working group will convert at least 100 courses/sections to open or more affordable course content options (defined as \$50 or less) over the next three years
- Use a multi-faceted approach to reach that goal, including open and affordable course content creation, adoption, adaption, and systematic leveraging of library-licensed content

We will work to ensure that the General Education curriculum is a transformative experience for all students. We will identify, propose, and pilot initiatives with potential to significantly enhance learning in General Education.

Identified Actions

- Create strategic proposals rooted in assessment data with the greatest potential for positive impact
- Promote contextual learning in STEM and other fields
- Help students learn to evaluate information and curate knowledge by developing faculty expertise in this area
- Assure appropriate course availability for students
- Identify opportunities to scaffold learning in General Education
- Examine opportunities for the expansion of SoTL within General Education

Goal 3 Experimentation with and expansion of innovative learning spaces and web-based instruction

Group Vision

Penn State will be the leader in developing learning spaces that are grounded in sound research, proven pedagogies, and emerging technologies. The spaces created at Penn State will drive new teaching methodologies, empower engaged student experiences, and provide a platform for transforming education through research proven spaces, technologies, and pedagogies. In addition to the spaces, the University will provide a sustained and robust faculty development program and ongoing technical, instructional design, and research resources to support and empower our outstanding faculty.

Working Group | Learning Spaces Leadership Committee for Learning Spaces

Goal 3 Experimentation with and expansion of innovative learning spaces and web-based instruction

Identified Actions

- Redefine the decision-making process for general purpose classrooms (GPC) to include increased faculty and student input and a research-based approach to learning spaces
- Redesign the proposal process to reflect University priorities, develop a complete budget, identify lifecycle funding, and present annually to University leadership
- Promote learning spaces experimentation and innovation that includes experimental spaces, faculty development, research support, and technology solutions to rapidly test and share results of emerging learning spaces

Working Group | Task Force on the Future of Online Education and the Role of the World Campus

Goal 3 Action on the recommendations of the Transforming Education Task Force: Framework for the Future of Online Learning and World Campus

Group Vision The group will create a vision and framework for online learning and its delivery in 2025.

Identified Actions

- Develop a culture and curriculum that will advance and expand:
 - quality online education across Penn State
 - support online education including multiple modalities of education (blended, hybrid, and fully online)
 - student access to courses
- Articulate a comprehensive approach that considers the learner experience from admission to graduation and beyond

Working Group | A Coordinated Plan for Instructional Design Resources

Goal 1 Assessment and preparation of coordinated plan for instructional design resources; Expand and ensure support for instructors/faculty and future faculty across the University

Group Vision Create a coordinated plan for providing effective instructional design support for faculty across the University.

Identified Actions

- Develop a coordinated plan to identify and assess instructional design resources and make them available to faculty
- Consider instructional design resources that meet both general needs and those nuanced by delivery modes (residential, hybrid, and fully online) and instructional environments (seminars, lectures, laboratories and field work)
- Recommend actions to expand and ensure support for current and future faculty by considering distributed resources and the University's learning design community

Provide Professional Development for All Instructors

Working Group | Faculty Development Resources

Goal 2 Survey of available training and support for pedagogical innovations in the classroom and from course to curricular levels; Explore flipped classrooms, hybrid instruction, blended curricula

Group Vision The vision for the FDR group is for all Penn State faculty and graduate instructors to be engaged in their own instructional development and willing to implement innovations that enhance students' learning by knowing where and how to access information, people, and services.

Identified Actions

- Inventory currently available resources and support for faculty and instructional development
- Identify gaps in resources and support for current and future faculty and graduate students
- Recommend additional resources to enhance support for faculty development
